Small Grants 2021: Key Facts



Small Grants Plus Programme opening September 2021 with funding available of between £10k –£30k for local road safety pilots and trials

Who can apply?

Local Authorities, Police Forces, Fire and Rescue Services, UK-based registered charities, universities, or community interest companies can apply. Organisations must be legally constituted to apply.

How do you apply for funding?

We will be accepting applications from 9 September until 18 October 2021. Applications should be made via our on-line portal on our website. You will hear the outcome of your application in December or January 2022.

What type of projects can apply?

Projects should have a practical purpose with the aim of trialling or testing ways to improve road safety.

How much funding is available?

The total amount of funding available is £120k and each project can apply for between £10k - £30k over a maximum of two years.

Is funding available for larger projects and for research?

Next year we plan to relaunch our themed funding round on the subject of fitness to drive. Larger grants can be applied for in that round of up to £200k over three years.
